### DEFERRED PAYMENT PLAN

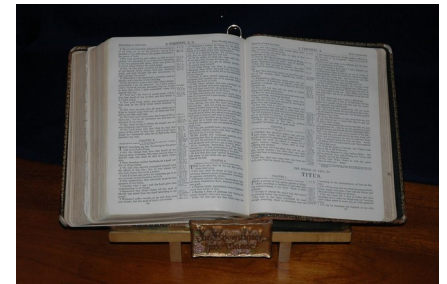
