* Students may take classes prior to applying for admissions. A limited number of credits may be earned before applying to a program is required.

DEFERRED PAYMENT PLAN

When unable to pay tuition in full, a student may arrange for deferred payments. There is a fee for this plan. It requires paying 1/3 of the tuition at the beginning, and two equal payments during the quarter.

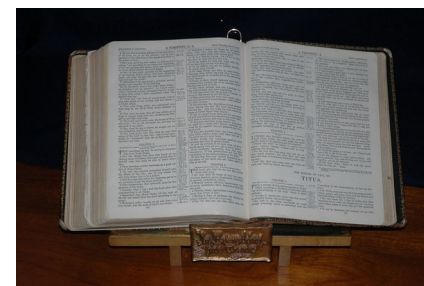
